

Copy of record from old Dozier Bible (Nash County, N. C.) Given by Jesse K. Dozier of Kirksville, Mo., February 1, 1901.

* William Dozier, Sr., (born January 23, 1723, died February 19, 1782) married Avalileh(?) Connell, July 15, 1753, who was born February 19, 1733.

* Captain James Dozier was born in Nash County, N. C., January 7, 1806, the son of the above mentioned Thomas (6). In 1828, he settled in Missouri, living at "Dozier's Landing" on the north side of the Missouri River. In 1844, he engaged in the steamboat business and owned the "Warsaw", "Lake of the Woods", "St. Louis", "Cora", "Mary Blane" and "Elvira." Later he or his sons owned the "Rowena", "Thomas E. Tutt", "Mollie Dozier", etc. Captain Dozier was an owner of slaves, but a kind and thoughtful master. Immediately after the war he removed to St. Louis and in 1867 formed a partnership with the well known baker, Joseph Garneau. Later this became the famous Dozier Bakery, one of the largest in the country. It has now been absorbed by the National Biscuit Co. Captain Dozier died July 15, 1878. The Doziers were among the leading citizens of St. Louis and all of the histories of St. Louis have portraits and sketches of this noted family.

THE VIRGINIA DOZIERS

(From John Dozier Lee, of Sumter, S. C. - 1920)
(and Dr. Dozier of Alabama - 1922)

In the year 1700, 700 French Huguenots, under the leadership of the Marquis de la Muce, landed in Virginia, and among them was a family of Doziers - - - . The first Dozier of this family that we have any record of is Leonard Dozier. He was born in Virginia in 1710, and was married there on January 30, 1733 to Ann _____ . Leonard died in 1785.
