My dear Mrs. Crothers:-

I was very glad to get your letter and be put in touch with another Dozier.

For years I have been gathering data on those who Now bear the name or are descended from the Doziers, and am well along in putting the material in shape for my own line.

You, perhaps, know that two different families, one originally spelled Dauger and one spelled Dozier, now spell it the same way-Dozier. I am trying to arrange these people into their right lines.

Your line is from Dauger; mine from Dozier. Both French Huguenot families.

I have a great deal of data on your line but some branches far from complete. The difficulty is that people give sometimes only the initials or only one name. As for instance, I have ever so many Willoughbys but, except in your family, no Cader Willoughbys. So I must get some more data before I can put your Cader in his right place. Eventually, I think I will. It is a puzzle, tho, at times, until someone gives me the missing link.

I enclose a chart of your immediate line. You see how incomplete it is. Can you fill out any of the missing parts? If so, please do it, and return to me. If you wish the chart returned to you, I will copy the data and return the chart to you. Later, when I make the proper connection, I will let you know.

Do you happen to know of any one else who is a Dozier or descends from one? I will appreciate any names and addresses that you may send me.
