

HOARE FAMILY SUMMARY

Our family came from England in 1728. The New England family came in 1600 or about that time. Miss Laura Hoar went to visit Senator George Frisbee Hoar , in Worcester, Mass. He told her that in England The Hoar ( Hoare) family held every important office outside of Royalty. Between 1300 and 1700 A.D. thirteen members of Parliament bore that name. For many years there had been a bank in England run the the Hoares. He showed her books in which many distinguished men's pictures were of the Hoare family. He also showed her the Family Crest, or Coat of Arms, which was an escutcheon upon a silver shield, an eagle displayed with a double head and a gold ring in it's beak. Motto- "CONSTANTER"

Our branch of the family came from Berkshire, Senator Hoars from Gloucester but he feels sure they are of the same family. Barbara Kurtz Hoar, in her old record of Births, and Deaths, says that Senator Ebenezer Rockwood Hoar, and Judge of the Judiciary at Washington D. O. are relatives.

Johanna Hoare, widow of Sheriff Charles Hoare, of Gloucester, England, came with her five children to Braintree, Mass. in 1640. Later her son Leonard became the first President of Harvard College. His wife Bridget Lisle, soon married Reverend Thomas Cotton - as - Leonard died three years after becoming President of Harvard.

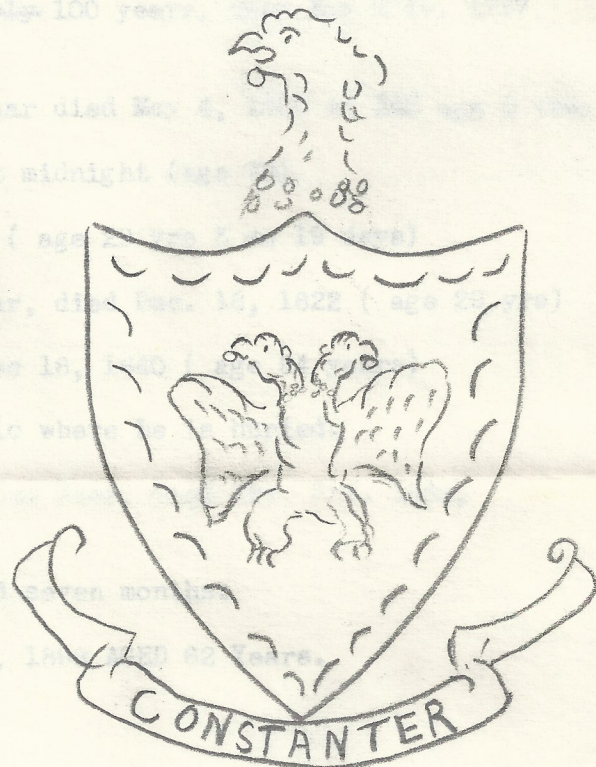
The story has been circulated that Adam Hoar, Sr. was stolen from England, but there is no proof of such a fact.
