My dear Madame:

Your letter asking for information of the Dozier family in Kentucky has been received.

On noting the information you had received from the Pennsylvania Historical Society I consulted the History of Sangamon County, Illinois, which we happen to have in our library. There I found practically the data you gave in your letter, with some additional data as to the descendants of John and Nancy Dozier.

I then consulted several other authorities which give the names of early settlers , in an effort to find the names of the parents of John Dozier, and if possible, the name of his wife. In the Kentucky Land Grant Book I found the names of John, James Ingo and Zachariah Dozier, all of whom made entries of large tracts of land in Nelson County Kentucky on Rough Creek, and also in other localities in the District. These entries were made between I78I and I785, at least those in Nelson were.

The list of marriage records for Nelson County show that one John Dozier married Elizabeth Lancaster, daughter of Raphael, July 5, 1785. I do not find there the marriage of ei-James Ingo or Zachariah Dozier, and Nelson County is some distance from Montgomery, but returning to the Sangamon County History I do find that the oldest child of John and Nancy Dozier was James I., and he had among others, sons James I., Junior, John and Zachariah.

The inference would seem to be that your John Dozier was wither the son or nephew of James Ingo, and and that his son James I. named his children for his father and uncles. That of course remains to be proved.

Going back farther, I find that there were Doziers in Richmond, Lancaster, Westmoreland Counties, Virginia. You no doubt have access to records of those counties.
